From Pastor Ginny:

The Gym Pastor -- an article from the January Edition of Living Lutheran, Erin Strybnis (Re-print)

When Ginny Price began her call as pastor of New Hope Lutheran Church, Columbia, Md., one of her first agenda items was to join a gym. "I take to heart the 'body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you ...' and have faithfully exercised for many years," she said, quoting 1 Corinthians 6:19. "Little did I realize the much larger impact this would have on me, the church and the community."

Between weight sets, Price read books like Bryan Stevenson's *Just Mercy* and Michelle Alexander's *A New Jim Crow*. The books garnered interest from fellow gym-goers, leading to talks on

racial justice and faith.

Price developed a close friendship with 28-year-old Steven Lewis, who spoke candidly with her about his concerns as a young African American man living in the era of Freddie Gray. "It was a really difficult time," she remembered.

One day, Lewis told Price he wanted to do something to "proactively strengthen the relationship between the black community and the police." Price agreed. Together, they formed Conversation in Come-UNITY. The bi-monthly meetings connect members of their gym, New Hope and the

community at large for discussions on racism, white privilege and current events. The talks have been a source of racial healing and reconciliation for all involved, Price said.

This led the duo to organize Come-UNITY Kickball, an annual game bringing together police with their community, particularly people of color, and Potluck with the Police, an opportunity to share a meal and stories of race relations.

Now, after two years of community organizing, Price said "the gym has changed. ... We're more connected because of this." And at New Hope,

members embrace racial justice as central to their ministry.

From the pulpit, she often asks the congregation, “Where is your gym?” meaning, “Where is the place you have an opportunity to minister to people in ways you would never imagine?”

Today, Price continues to be a fixture at the gym. In fact, she’s so popular there, she’s often interrupted while writing sermons on the step machine. Price, for one, is grateful for the opportunity for outreach.

“I have become, in effect, a gym pastor,” she said. “Meeting people where they are at the gym, discovering and sharing God’s love, exercising physical and spiritual muscles, has produced much fruit in unexpected ways and places.”




ELCA Creation Care Update




A Synod Family Event

Conversations about the Rest of Your Life



How do you plan for the rest of your life as you age? Where will you live? What will you do about health care and facing your own mortality? A joint discussion on these issues will take place at New Hope, a conversation between New Hope and The Lutheran Village at Millers Grant (LVMG) We begin by showing the PBS video "Being Mortal" based on the book Being Mortal by Atul Gawande, followed by a discussion led by someone from Gilchrist Hospice, on Friday March 29, from 7-9 pm. On Sunday April 7, from 6-8 pm we will have several speakers leading discussions. LVMG Chaplain Stacey Brady will bring a faith perspective to the conversation about aging, including funeral planning. Michelle Rosenheim, Executive Director LVMG, will discuss the faith perspective of aging and living choices. A representative from Right at Home, home care assistance, will provide information.

LVMG is committed to reaching out to local church communities, sharing their experience in senior care. Striving to be good stewards of the gifts God has entrusted to them, they seek to strengthen relationships with the wider church.

This topic will be helpful for those thinking about planning their retirement years, as well as for those with family members facing these decisions. Dessert will be provided.

Sacrament of Holy Communion

During Lent, Deacon Cindy will be teaching the first and second grade Sunday School class about the sacrament of Holy Communion. The age-appropriate curriculum is called Fed and Forgiven, published by Augsburg Fortress. Beginning March 10, students will start in 10 am worship, as they have been all year, and will proceed downstairs after the children's sermon with the other Sunday School classes. Although it's not required, parents are invited to attend class if they'd like to. This is the same curriculum we used last year, and although it might be the second year for some students, the review is always helpful.

After completing the classes, if the student hasn't already received their first communion, they will be invited to do that on Maundy Thursday, April 18th, of Holy Week. As always, if your child wants to receive first communion but can't be there on Maundy Thursday, an alternative date can be arranged.

It is also a tradition for the children to bake the bread for communion; a date for that will be arranged closer to Holy Week.

STAR WORDS

Here we are, heading into Lent with our Star Words from Epiphany.

We are so good at being busy and “doing things” in our lives – including, and especially, here at New Hope, serving others. All of that is necessary and good, but it’s also important for us to “be still and know that I am God.” Psalm 46:10a. Lent is a time set apart to do that, a time for us to concentrate on spiritual “exercises” to provide a space for us to connect with God.

Last month we talked about defining our Star Words and reflecting on that. This month I turn to scripture. In January one congregation member told me that she looked her word up in the Bible and told me how many times her Star Word appeared in scripture. Great idea! I’m sure then she looked up those passages to see the context in which it was used.

Thoughts to ponder and journal: After reading the scripture, was there one that really spoke to you? Why? What might God be trying to say to you through that experience? Was there more than one place it appeared in the Bible? Perhaps concentrate on one scripture reading a month. Is it used in the Old as well as the New Testament? If so, is it used differently or in the same context?

What if your Star Word doesn’t appear at all in scripture? What might that mean? Is there a synonym that does? Does your Star Word make you think of another word that is in scripture? Does it instead appear in a hymn or a creed? How is it used there?

I hope you find this helpful because I’m sure once you start asking questions, other questions, answers and ideas will come to you. And don’t forget, on the 6th of every month we’ll talk about our insights on New Hope’s Facebook page.

A SEASON OF HOPE Lenten Journey for Lutheran World Relief

Starting March 10 we will be collecting items for LWR's Personal Care Kits. We will be assembling them on Palm Sunday, April 14, between services. This year we hope to assemble 100 kits. You can help by donating items, sponsoring a Thrivent Action Team to purchase items, assembling kits at home and bring them on Palm Sunday, or help assemble the kits on Palm Sunday. New Hope serves dinner at Baker Street on the 3rd Saturday of January, May, and November. We serve dinner at West Street on the 3rd Saturday of March (Boy Scouts serve and we supply food), July, September.
