## ***FROM THE PASTOR***

### *Festival of Homiletics*

May 16-19<sup>th</sup> I participated in the annual Festival of Homiletics (preaching) for continuing education. New Hope provides its leaders with annual continuing education. The Festival of Homiletics is an annual event at various locations around the country. This year the conference was held in Atlanta. I would like to share a few words about this experience.

First, thank you for your care for leaders in providing space and funding for continuing education. It's so important to be nourished and mentally as well as spiritually stimulated through learning.

I lost count of how many sermons and lectures there were (the schedule was from 8:45 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.). The amazing reality was that each one was better than the last! I was so inspired by the Word of God and the gifts of the presenters. The theme for this years' festival in Atlanta was 'Prophetic Preaching in Times of Change'. Here are a just few quotes from a lecture about prophetic preaching: "Prophets in the Old Testament are truth-tellers." "And prophets are only able to tell the future because they see the present reality and what will happen." "People also don't want to hear the truth, and so being a prophet, a truth-teller, is difficult work." Further, in order to be a prophetic preacher, "you must be empowered to speak and embody your own truth". (All of the above comes from Karoline Lewis, a preaching professor at Luther Seminary.)

Preaching is a vital task of the church – proclaiming God's good news in the midst of our world. Through the Holy Spirit this good news has the power to transform us, to inspire us, to convict us in our faith. The Gospel is needed now more than ever!

Part of the gift of the Festival is that presenters are from a variety of denominations and cultures, therefore expanding my understanding of what it means to be a leader in the church today. One particular highlight was the sermon of Rev. Dr. Raphael Warnock, currently serving as pastor at Ebenezer Baptist in Atlanta, once held by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King. I thought it must take a lot of courage and faith to stand in King's pulpit. He did so with great humility, grace and power.

Look for slight changes in my preaching style. I will be adding a variation for the Global services on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays with a greater emphasis on participation from the congregation. Definitely you will be hearing quotes sprinkled throughout the coming Sundays from many of the sermon gems I heard.

## Synod Assembly - OC, Maryland

Every year each congregation is send representatives to the De/Md Synod Assembly. At these gatherings we decide on important issues for the synod through resolutions and memorials as well as elect representatives for

the synod. This year we are sending 7 representatives. It will be held June 2-4 at Ocean City. The theme is "God's Church: Led by the Spirit" and the keynote speaker is The Rev. Dr. Dave Daubert, the Lead Consultant and Managing Partner for Day 8 Strategies, which does coaching and consulting for faith-based organizations and their leaders. Dave is the author of three books, most notably the popular "Living the L-Word: Renewing your Congregation."

We will also be electing a bishop this year. Our synod utilizes the "ecclesiastical ballot" in the belief that the election is as much a call process and depends on the stirrings of God's Holy Spirit. The first ballot, to be taken during the first business session, serves as a nominating ballot, and every rostered ordained minister of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is eligible to be elected.

When our congregation's representatives return, we will inform you of the business that was decided upon.


Pray for us as we travel and for the church in its work.





Dear people of New Hope:

Thank you for your generous gift of \$1,000 to support the work of Lutheran Campus Ministry. It is a great joy to know that so many people support the work we do in Jesus' name on our college campuses. Classes end on May 10th, and that means that we are in the midst of goodbyes and celebration dinners and it means we are praying a lot for students who are full of stress and caffeine and light on sleep! But it's also a time to look back and see what God has been up to among us this semester.

A few weeks ago, we opened a food pantry on Towson's campus for students who are hungry, a ministry we will continue to share with the Catholic campus ministry. We'll get to open it a few times a week, including during our monthly Community Table free meal where hungry folks in our community share a meal with students. It's a Table that looks a lot like the ones where Jesus ate.

And last night at UMBC, we talked about how God helps us find our way in the dark (something very real to students getting ready to graduate, transfer and go on foreign study!) by reading stories of the saints- those who have taken daring risks in following Jesus. We need to hear from those who walked the journey of faith before us when life is confusing. And every student left with a different book so that the voices of faith will go with them. The only requirement is that they let me know what God happens to say to them through the words this summer- I can't wait!

And at Morgan State we will gather tonight to send students off for the summer and hear the stories of how their faith and their service has changed the lives of those they serve on a weekly basis in drug recovery homes, soup kitchens and nursing homes. It's a yearly tradition, but hearing what God does through our students is always a reminder of why we keep at this work of pointing students to Jesus on campus and supporting them in their service. It's also where we will get to hand out treat bags from New Hope to show the students the support of the whole church during their exams. Thank you for continuing to make these bags for us!

This is work that you help to make possible and it is vital work in God's kingdom. Thank you for partnering with us in the work of the gospel.

## CARE BAGS FOR THE HOMELESS

As you may know, we keep a supply of care bags for you to take with you to hand to someone in need. We ask that if you are handing out the bags in Howard County that you take an information card about the Day Resource Center and place it in the bag. What you may not know is why those particular supplies, who assembles the bags, and where do we get the supplies from.

Why those supplies? Water to keep hydrated, snacks to keep nourished – especially protein. Socks because these are the least donated items to shelters/pantries. Chap Stick/sunscreen for protection from the weather, plastic gallon bags to help keep items dry. Many people will use these bags to keep other possessions dry as well.

Who assembles the bags? The bags have been assembled by either the high school youth or the confirmation students. With summer upon us, everyone will have the chance to help assemble the bags between services on an as-needed basis.

Where do we get the supplies? The supplies come from you, either through direct donation of the specific items, or through your specific designated monetary donations. We are currently in need of both. The supplies we need are **men's white calf socks, 20 oz bottles of water or Gatorade type drinks, individual snacks like fruit snacks, cracker sandwiches, power bars, granola bars, protein bars, bags of nuts, jiff to go cups, chapstick, travel sunscreen, and inexpensive rain ponchos**. These supplies may be placed in the bin in the coat closet marked Bags for Homeless. Monetary donations may be placed in the offering plate marked **Bags for Homeless**.



## Photo Shoot for Lutheran World Relief

**From LWR:** We get lots and lots of photos from congregations making quilts and kits for LWR, and every now and then we get a really great shot, but we've realized that it would benefit us to stage some assembly photos just to broaden our collection of photos for use in publications. We decided to stage assemblies here, in North Carolina (where we have a staff person) and in Minnesota (where we also have a staff person).

So that's where the amazing folks at New Hope come in! You have a wonderfully supportive and engaged congregation and youth program, AND your building is beautiful and has great lighting – a perfect combo for this project.

We have actually sourced the supplies to make 15 Personal Care Kits, 15 School Kits, 8 Baby Care Kits and 3 fleece tied blankets. Our thought is that we would try to set up a day sometime in August before students (and teachers) are back in school when we could bring all the supplies to you and set up a very specific shot list of photos. At the end, we'll actually assemble everything and it will all go to the warehouse, but the main purpose of this is to get pictures, so folks would basically be signing up to be models for a day. It will probably take at least a few hours to get all the photos before we can get to the much faster work of putting everything together.

The photo shoot will take place on Friday, August 12, 10 am – 3 pm with lunch provided. We are looking for 15 people, ages 8 and older, who are interested in this project. If you are interested, please contact Kathy Piet (410-992-0645 or [kampers1@verizon.net](mailto:kampers1@verizon.net)).



## Delaware Maryland SYNOD EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH IN AMERICA

New Hope is entitled to four lay delegates to the upcoming meeting of the Delaware-Maryland Synod. In addition to Pastor Ginny and Diaconal Minister Cindy, the delegates include Jada Garret, Mary Thomas, Juanita Walker, Janice Nicholas, and Charles Nicholas as a non-voting observer.

As you may be aware, the congregation is looking at various options in terms of expanding our building. To make a long story shorter, we can expand the sanctuary, remodel the narthex, and enclose the portico for somewhat above \$1 million. The expanded sanctuary would safely hold more than two hundred, and the new portico and narthex will be a more welcoming, less congested area. The sense of the council was that we want to proceed with the planning process, and present as much information as we have to the congregation at some time in the next few months. A vote at a congregational meeting called for that purpose would be required to proceed with any construction, and to start the capital campaign needed to take on a project of this size. Stay tuned!


