From the Pastor

FREE RIDE

I've just returned from a weekend spent with over 190 middle schoolers! I was a 'small group leader', which means I was a leader for a dozen 8th graders, one of which was from our congregation. Together for four sessions, we learned about Global Grace with whom and how we are connected to our neighbors around the world and we shared our hearts and faith in the process. Each group was assigned a country. Ours was the occupied country of Palestine. We had 5 youth from New Hope at the event.

There are a couple of points I learned and would like to share from the weekend. First of all, how wonderful for middle schoolers to be able to gather and play and sing and learn and pray and grow and...you get the picture. Our synod creates this event every year. A portion of the monies we put in the offering plate every Sunday goes to support the Delaware-Maryland Synod. The synod administration in turn shares a portion with our national church for further reaching ministries (Global Grace in action!), while using other monies for such events...a good use of resources.

Secondly, there are many dedicated adult and young adult helpers throughout our church who give of their time and heart to nurture these young people. It's beautiful to see!

Thirdly, the young people not only learned about their global neighbors and how to respect their traditions, languages and cultures. They learned how they are loved by adults in their own congregational communities, as they witnessed adults putting their faith in action by being there for the weekend.

Fourthly, I relearned how difficult it is to be a young person of faith today. In this time of turmoil and perceived hopelessness, young people more than ever need to know of God's amazing grace toward and love for the world and how God has not abandoned them or this world.

And finally, we have a significant responsibility for our young people's growth in the faith. Our commitment to nurture the faith they've been given, to respect their insights in the faith, to be open for honest discussion of struggles and concerns they (and we) may have is critical for them and us. And as always is the case with our faith, as we give we receive so much in return. I have returned from this trip exhausted, yet energized and hopeful for the church, for young people, for our world.

Hymn of the Month:

Our Growing in Faith Together (GIFT) parable for November is “Wheat and Weeds”, a story Jesus told in Matthew 13:24–30. The last three verses of *Come, Ye Thankful People, Come* are based on that parable. (“Tares” is an old word for “weeds” – you may have noticed that the language in this song is old-timey! We sing “ye” instead of “you,” and “thy” and “thine” instead of “your.” Can you find other unfamiliar words?)

The first verse is one that many people associate with Thanksgiving. The term “harvest home” comes from a festive celebration in England. It took place at the end of the harvest, when all the ripe fruits, vegetables, and grains were collected and stored (in a “garner” or storehouse) in preparation for winter. So this is a good song for us to sing in November, as we look forward to Thanksgiving!

Information about Family Ministry and Faith Formation at New Hope.

At my first youth workers workshop about fifteen years ago and at the last faith formation workshop I attended last year, I heard the same words: parents have the most influence when it comes to nurturing the faith in their children. Martin Luther knew that too, 500 years ago.

But isn't that a bit daunting? I mean, as a parent, we all have enough on our plates! Some of us aren't sure where our faith stands, let alone being responsible for passing it on to our children. And how are we supposed to do it when our lives are so busy as it is?

Fortunately, there are resources to help us out. Every week we include "Taking Faith Home" as an insert in the Ministry Connections. That resource is *Milestone Ministries* and provides ways for us to integrate faith practices at home. It revolves around the four keys of faith practices: caring conversation, devotions, rituals and traditions and service. There are short Bible verses, prayers, questions to think about and service project suggestions for families of all shapes and sizes (and individuals too). If you leave without taking one home, it's available on our website, too.

Another resource is called Faith Five from "Faith Inkubators". Here are the five steps:

One – discuss highs and lows of the day

Two – read a verse from the Bible

Three – Talk about the verse as it relates to the highs and lows

Four – pray about the highs and lows, family, the world

Five – Bless one another





NEW HOPE IS PARTNERING WITH KITTAMAQUNDI COMMUNITY CHURCH (KCC)

As they co-sponsor a refugee family with Lutheran Social Services (LSS).

We began our partnership this past summer when, on short notice, New Hope generously and graciously donated enough supplies for 10 household items kits. Our partnership continues as KCC continues on its path to co-sponsorship. KCC is hoping to sponsor a Muslim family with children (maximum family size of 4) ready for resettlement before the end of 2016.



New Hope's initial commitment is to pay one month's rent, up to \$2000, in 2017. Half of that amount has been placed in New Hope's 2017 budget as our yearly donation to Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS). The other half is coming from a return of our donation to the Oromo Church from the synod that the council approved for refugee support.

Co-sponsorship of a refugee family is at least a 6 month commitment that involves securing housing, preparing the home with furniture, household items, food, transportation, job searches, tutoring in English, and helping to adjust to life in the US. KCC has organized teams around each of these areas. If you would like to help one of the teams please contact the team leader listed in the chart below.
